The Department of Molecular Genetics is seeking 2 Teaching Assistants for the following course:

## MGY2771H Introduction to Medical Microbiology

An introductory course on the fundamentals of medical microbiology. Course content includes units on bacteria, viruses, eukaryotic pathogens, microbial growth in the lab, microbial identification and classification, antibiotic resistance, epidemiology, vaccines and immunity and pathogenicity.

#### Qualifications

Applicants will be considered based on their knowledge of microbiology, immunology and/or infectious diseases as gained through some combination of coursework & research project work.
